The school was represented by School Captains, Rebecca Chew and Blake Im at the Chatswood RSL ceremony held in the Memorial Rose Garden on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup>. for your interest and commitment to this important day. Ben De Vries from Year 11 represented NSW at the Cenotaph in Martin Place on Remembrance Day. Ben was a Premier's Scholarship participant visiting the battlefields fields of France earlier in the year. As a result of his outstanding participation while on this tour Ben was selected to take part in this ceremony.



I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank Julie Farquhar for her outstanding leadership of the Chatswood High School P&C. At the last Annual General Meeting Julie did not stand for re-election as her daughter Belinda has just finished the HSC. When I first arrived at Chatswood High School Julie was an invaluable source of support and guidance and has continued to provide stability and a depth of understanding that I have valued. Julie sat with me on many committees and always worked for the benefit of every student in the school and for those who will enter the school in the future. 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### CHS P&C – What we did in 2017

2017 has seen lots of activities and projects completed by your P&C.

Our aims are simple. We want to bring together the CHS community, the students, school and families to advance the best interests of students and the school. We aim to support the school in providing opportunities to make high school an enriching and engaging time for all our students.

Here are some 2017 highlights and how we spent your contributions:

- New quadrangle landscaping and seating (\$31,000)
- Duke of Edinburgh Program open to students in year 9 & above - paying specialist teacher (\$12,000)
- New STEM technology equipment (\$25,000)
- MacLit - a Macquarie Uni literature program to support students (\$4,600)
- High Resolves Leadership programs for years 7-10 (\$15,000 funded by grant Chatswood RSL)
- Leadership camps & Elevate study skills – open to all students (\$6,500)
- 3 Wellbeing sessions for students and parents (Respectful Relationships & Consent, Problem Internet Usage, Sleep - the missing ingredient for Success) (\$6,000)
- Merit awards and Yr 12 Farewell year book (\$4,000)
- Social events – "Around the world" Trivia, Barefoot Bowls & BBQ and Welcome to Yr 7 & new families' evenings.



We also made the difficult decision to cease operating the canteen (its operating model was no longer financially sustainable). We would like to extend a sincere thank you to Maureen Chaffey and her dedicated team for providing fresh, healthy & nutritious food to our students over the past 9 years.

**Looking ahead to 2018**, we are already working closely with the Principal and key teachers on several initiatives including funding of co-curricular sport activities (to use our fantastic new oval). We will continue with well-being sessions for students, funding the Duke of Edinburgh & literature programs. Also we have commenced design work to refurbish student toilets (hoping to commence building work in early 2018). Several social events (multicultural) are also in planning.

You will also hear a lot more on the proposed NSW Department of Education Development of a Chatswood Educational Precinct – currently at the consultation & planning stage. We want to raise awareness within the school community & be an active voice focusing attention on our high school students' needs. The proposal currently focusses on our neighbouring public school needs, without adequately taking into consideration that of the high school. This needs urgent action. I'd like to thank our outgoing President, Mrs Julie Farquhar for her tireless contributions and dedication over the past 2 years. We achieved so much during 2017 under her leadership and are very pleased she is staying actively involved in our CHS P&C community in 2018.

### STEM News – Universal Testing Machine



Chatswood High School along with the significant contribution from the P&C, have purchased a Universal Testing Machine (UTM) and finally have it up and running. The UTM is capable of tensile, compression and bending tests using metal, wood or plastic.

Year 11 Engineering Studies students used it to test metals in relation to breaking systems. These students are currently using the UTM in relation to civil structures and bridges. The UTM can be used in Science to demonstrate such things as Hooke's Law. The UTM is helpful in Mathematics in relation to graphing,

formulae and algebra. On behalf of the students and teachers, we are extremely grateful and thankful for the contribution from the P&C; this is a great opportunity for our students to experience a real life application of an industry standard machine used in engineering with many applications using science and mathematics.

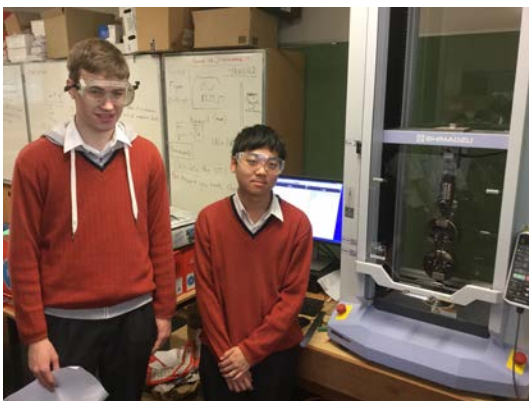

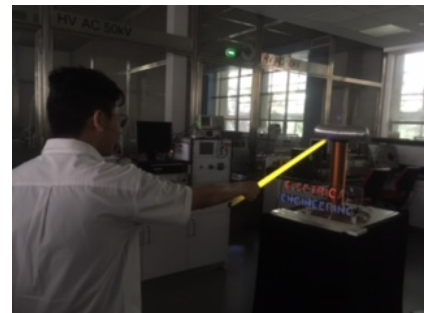

### UNSW Engineering Day

Year 11 Engineering Studies students went to the UNSW Engineering Day. Students had the opportunity to visit three Engineering Faculties of their choice. Petroleum Engineering was a favourite as students had to blow up a balloon through a Tim Tam or a Peppermint Crisp, demonstrating the ability of a fluid to leach through a porous solid. Some students failed to do this, eating the Tim Tam first.

Students at the Electrical Engineering faculty mimicked using a Star Wars light sabre with a fluorescent tube and a Tesla coil. They also had the ability to race robots using mobile phones to control them. In the Computer Science faculty students could program robots.

Students at the Civil Engineering faculty designed bridges out of wood and string and tested them to destruction. Students appreciated having the opportunity to learn about the different types of engineering on offer at university (and the ATAR required for entry!)

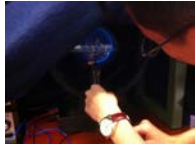

## Kickstart Report

The HSC Physics course is a fascinating subject and students with an interest in mathematics and the strangeness of the natural world are recommended to consider it for HSC.



On Friday 25th August 2017 Chatswood High's HSC Physics classes made a visit to the Physics laboratories at Sydney Uni. There they had an exciting demonstration of some of the 20th and 21st centuries' most exciting and bewildering physics. This included: A demonstration of the photoelectric effect. Light shone onto a metal surface can knock electrons out of it, but only if the light is high energy light - blue or UV light. Famously, Albert Einstein used this strange property to deduce the particle nature of light in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Chatswood students (L to R: Gabriel Aravena-Brogan, Liang Pan, Danny Won and Nic Rodwell) here are seen calculating Planck's constant (a quantity of great importance in quantum mechanics) using the photoelectric effect.



One of the Big Questions at the turn of the century was the nature of mysterious "cathode rays". The circular path of a cathode ray in a magnetic field, seen in this photograph as a blue semi-circle observed by Roger Zhang of Chatswood High, was used by J.J. Thomson at Cambridge University in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century to calculate the charge-to-mass ratio of the electron, the first sub-atomic particle discovered.



Most amazingly, Chatswood students saw the jaw-dropping levitation of a magnet. This can occur when a superconductor is cooled below its critical temperature by liquid nitrogen. The levitation has to be seen to be believed and unfortunately the photo doesn't quite capture it. Students L-R: Tate Adams, Joshua Lee, Eddie Wong,

On Tuesday the 31<sup>st</sup> October eleven Indigenous students from Kununurra High School in far northern WA made a special visit to Chatswood High. The boys were visiting Sydney through the Clontarf Foundation, which exists to improve the education and employment prospects of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men. These eleven boys are from a social and geographic environment many, many miles from those of Chatswood students. The visit was aimed, in a small way, at promoting reconciliation and understanding between the two different worlds: Sydney's lower North Shore and regional Indigenous Australia. To this end, a Chatswood Year 10 PDHPE class and the Kununurra students were capably put through their paces in a PE lesson by teacher Sean Dowdall. Afterwards students enjoyed a sausage sizzle and a chance to mingle. The Kununurra boys astounded some Chatswood students with their vertical leap on the basketball courts. The Kununurra boys and Chatswood students were a credit to themselves and their schools.
